






- Phase I January through October 2016

Successful promise programs

- Provide more than a scholarship
- The message is key
- Support and services are critical
- Examples:
 - Tennessee Promise
 - Detroit Promise post-MDRC assistance
 - TN Promise local precursor in Knoxville

Defining an Adult Promise Program...



 Promotes a simple, transparent message that postsecondary education is affordable for adult learners.



 Makes a financial commitment to adult students through leveraging aid from all available sources. Commits to fill in the gaps where needed to cover tuition and fees.



 Establishes and supports programs and services that are tailored to the unique needs of adult students and will help them succeed in postsecondary education.



An Adult Promise Program must address unique adult learner challenges

- Exhausted aid eligibility may drive up cost to provide last dollar scholarship
- State and institutional buy-in (especially fear of overpromising)
- State financial aid policies and eligibility requirements
- Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) cannot be reset
- Outreach challenges
- Cost to tailor services to adult students or expand hours to meet adult student schedules

Is the "some college, no degree" student really a *low hanging fruit*?

Design Template overview

- Make the case to serve adult students
- Collect data to understand adult learner characteristics in state/locality
- Critically assess past efforts
- Provide options for setting up pilot program parameters
- Describe possible supports and services key to student success
- Estimate the cost of last dollar scholarship
- Obtain institutional buy-in
- Establish program evaluation parameters and process

In hindsight, should have recommended policy audits of current policies to assess alignment with adult learners needs.

Program parameters (i.e., how to pilot)

- Student type
 - Income caps (e.g., up to \$75,000)
 - Prior credit requirements (e.g., 50% of degree requirements)
 - Age limits
 - Stop outs
- Degree type (two-year, four-year, certificates)
- Pilot institutions or statewide



Continuum of support for adult student success



OUTREACH, MARKETING, AND ENROLLMENT

- Data challenges
- Targeting messaging
- Focus groups
- Debt forgiveness



SUPPORTS FOR ADULT STUDENT SUCCESS

- Mentoring
- Credit for prior learning
- Degree maps
- Structured scheduling
- Alternative instructional delivery



RETENTION AND COMPLETION

- Continued mentoring
- Emergency aid funding
- •On-campus childcare or childcare vouchers
- Extended hours for support services



Supports and services that resonate with pilot states

- Targeted outreach and messaging
- More intensive coaching over mentoring
- Micro grants/debt forgiveness
- Emergency aid programs
- Financial literacy programming
- Maximize benefits from all public resources
- Connections to workforce and economic needs



Takeaways and lessons learned

- Program implementation is slow going
 - Coalition building and nurturing
 - Connect to statewide attainment effort (Maine)
 - Connect to workforce and economic needs (Oklahoma)
- Lack of data on adult learners
 - Outdated contact information and lack of nuanced data about potential adult students
 - Rely on student-level financial aid data (Washington)
 - Collect detailed data through application process (Tennessee*)
 - Set up program evaluation protocols (Minnesota)



Takeaways and lessons learned (continued)

- Returning students may face barriers due to past attempts at higher education
 - SAP cannot be reset
 - States and institutions are looking for creative ways to address challenges
 - Policy audit and reform (Indiana)
 - Institutional holds and debt
 - Micro grant program (Washington)
 - Warrior Way Back program (Wayne State Univ.*)



Takeaways and lessons learned (continued)

- Adult learners need intensive coaching
 - Length of time since last educational experience
 - Fear of failure (or failing again)
 - Setting up Navigators to work with students throughout program (ME, MN, OK, WA)
- Fear of over-promising/concerns about cost of last dollar scholarship
 - Impending economic downturn
 - Unknown financial status of potential students
 - Lack of strong state financial aid program
 - Strong coalition building and connecting to business community encourages multiple partners to help fund (Oklahoma)

Overview

- Indiana's Goal: that 60% of Hoosiers hold a quality degree or credential beyond high school by 2025
- Indiana ranks 42nd in the nation with an attainment rate of **41.9**%
- Indiana needs over 600K new degrees with only 550K students graduating high school by 2025

Overview

- Indiana ranks 5th in the nation in need-based aid
- Financial aid generally designed for traditionalaged students

- Reforms have helped traditional-aged students
 - But made it all the more important that we improve adult-focused aid

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Direct Outreach



Direct Outreach

- Outreach focused on individuals who:
 - Attended college within the last 10 years
 - Earned 25% or more of the credits needed to graduate
 - Had not earned any degree
- With 150k from the Lilly Endowment, the Commission sent:
 - 125,000 postcards with individualized URLs
 - **300,000** emails
 - **32,000+** outbound calls

The 2017 General Assembly created the Workforce Ready Grant program to provide free training for working-age Hoosiers in the state's highest demand jobs and sectors:

- Advanced Manufacturing
- Building & Construction
- Health & Life Sciences
- Information Technology & Business Services
- Transportation & Logistics

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WRG Requirements

- Be an Indiana resident and an eligible U.S. citizen
- Have a high school diploma or equivalency diploma/GED but less than a college degree
- Enroll in a qualifying certificate program at Ivy Tech Community College or Vincennes University
- Enroll at least as a half-time student
