

#### MDRC TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR DETROIT PROMISE PATH

- Diagnosis: Understand student needs and current academic outcomes
- Technical assistance: Collaborated with the Chamber to apply research to needs of this student population
- Behavioral science: Trained staff on effective student communication using behavioral science concepts
- Data coaching: Developed and maintained a Management Information System to track student participation; collected and reviewed data on student outcomes
- Formative feedback: Implementation research and student survey



#### PROMISE SUCCESS INITIATIVE OVERVIEW

- MDRC will work with colleges to strengthen new or existing programs at no cost
- Short RFP process to select programs for indepth work
- All programs will be able to join webinars and access resources

## **PROPOSAL TIMELINE**



\*Contingent on funding

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND SELECTION CRITERIA**

A diverse group of programs will be selected with a goal of including programs at various stages, from newly developed to established, that serve varying student populations, from recent high school graduates to nontraditional populations.

## **Selection Criteria:**

- Broad Support for the Program
- Financial Stability
- Program and Evidence
- Student Population
- Commitment to the Promise Success Initiative

## **BROAD SUPPORT FOR THE PROGRAM**

Assesses a program's support from multiple levels within the organization, from leadership to administrators to program staff, as well as with partner organizations (e.g., college and community partners).

## **FINANCIAL STABILITY**

Assesses a program's finances for running and sustaining their Promise program. Does the program have the support of local funders to operate the program and to consider the implementation of college success components (beyond the scholarship) long-term?

## PROGRAM AND EVIDENCE

Assesses a program's current or proposed model and intention to use evidence-based best practices; commitment to use data to improve performance; and commitment and capacity to build on its current evidence base.

#### STUDENT POPULATION

Assesses to what extent a program serves lowincome students in communities with great need throughout the United States, and the total number of students who could be served.

#### COMMITMENT TO THE PROMISE SUCCESS INITIATIVE

Assesses a program's motivation for the project; interest in goal of adding new evidence-based supports; designation of a strong project team; participation/commitment from all partners; and willingness to work with MDRC on technical assistance activities through 2019.
